#### **Discussion**

**Aditi:** So, *Draw the Line* is a protest happening all over the world this Saturday. A few UBC students asked us to endorse it, and we did send out a special "Vote by Email," but not enough people participated.

The protest is happening in Vancouver as well. Here's a printout from the website it's a bit long, but it states:

"We refuse to stand by while the government and Canada's richest corporations gut our public services, fuel climate collapse, attack migrants, exploit Indigenous lands, and prop up the genocide in Palestine."

If you want, you can read through the full list of demands quickly. The protest has also been endorsed by, for example, the SFU Student Society and others.

I thought it might be a cool initiative for us to consider endorsing. Many of the GSS values align with the goals of this protest, and they likely align with your values too.

**Katelynn**: I just want to encourage everyone to support this. One of the organizers, Balraj, is an incredible human being. Even if you don't know him personally, simply showing up to support him is meaningful.

Unfortunately, I can't attend because I'll be picking my mom up from the airport, but I would if I could. I highly recommend people show up, not only because this is a wonderful cause, but also given the many political issues happening globally right now. This protest isn't just happening in Vancouver, it's taking place in many other locations worldwide. I think it's really important that we endorse it.

Showing up allows us to make our voices heard, especially as people in positions of lesser power, to say that we do not accept these injustices. This is particularly significant at such a pivotal moment in the world.

I also want to note that CUPE 2278 has endorsed this protest. As one of the co-chairs of the Student Workers Advocacy Group, a subcommittee between CUPE 2278 and the GSS, I would be remiss not to mention this.

Please consider showing up, it would be amazing to see our community there in support.

#### 4.3 EXECUTIVE PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT FUND

**Description:** The HFC, in consultation with HRC and CPC, has developed a new policy section (Executive Policy 14: Executive Professional Development Fund). The policy establishes guidelines for Executive Officers to pursue approved professional development opportunities. This fund is distinct from the staff course fee subsidy in the GSS HR Manual and is intended to enhance Executive performance.

#### **Discussion**

**Katelynn:** This is something we brought up a couple of times earlier this summer. Right now, when there is no EOC Chair, we run into issues, especially when we need timely approval for things like upcoming class funds. For example, if a dean wants guidance on how to talk to a politician and there is no EOC Chair, the necessary funds or approvals cannot be processed. In the case of the EOC, it is also inappropriate for the President to step in as Chair. What is our contingency plan for situations like this?

I don't think we have any questions because you did a really thorough job with this presentation, addressing our concerns both as a Council and creating a solid policy. Everything is planned smoothly thanks to all the hard work you put in. So, thank you.

**Description:** Nursing graduate students received a referendum to collect an annual fee of \$60 towards their new Gateway building for the next 30 years. The referendum passed 65.9% so they have requested that GSS to help with the fee collections.

#### **Discussion**

A 2020 referendum approved a \$60 annual fee from each nursing student, but there is currently no clear mechanism for collecting it. The proposal is for the GSS to collect the fees and redistribute them to UBC through an MOU with the Board of Governors. Council members asked questions about whether this would function like other student fees, why the AMS is not handling it, and whether there is a benefit to the GSS taking this on. Concerns were raised about the workload this might create for GSS staff and executives. It was noted that the GSS has previously collected fees for other programs, such as the Master of Business Analytics, though the process and responsibilities on the back end were unclear.
